FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Unfortunately, we are seeing an uptick in COVID cases this week. The symptoms being reported are mild (sore throat/tickle, slight cough). Please monitor your student(s) carefully and test if symptoms develop. The Health Office has COVID tests available if you need them.

Our current COVID guidelines are a 5-day quarantine which starts the day after symptom onset or positive test. Students can return to school on Day 6 if symptoms are improved and they have been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication. We recommend students wear masks at school on Days 6-10 but it is not required. Please notify the Health Office of any positive results. Thanks for your cooperation.

READ-A-THON IS COMING! FEBRUARY 1-28

"Bolder, Prouder, Stronger Readers"

Ready, set, read! Deephaven Elementary will hold its annual Read-A-Thon event and fundraiser during the month of February. The Read-A-Thon reinforces good reading habits in students while funding more than half of our school's PTA activities including school-wide field trips, teacher grants, STEM events, library books, and educational apps like IXL and Lexia. Last year, 90% of our students participated in the Read-A-Thon.

How it works:

- Students request and receive pledges from friends and family. Sponsors may pledge an amount for each minute read or a flat amount for the entire event.
- Students can win prizes by reading and logging their minutes into the Read-A-Thon website. Prizes are cumulative this year!

Goals this year:

- 90% student participation
- 640,000 minutes read

• \$60,000 raised

If each participant secured \$100 in pledges, we would meet our goal to raise \$60,000! Flyers with event details will be sent home soon. Let's help our kids build their reading skills while supporting our school!
