FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Happy New Year! Welcome back to the routine of work and school for your family. I hope you enjoyed winter break! The next three months, we typically have minimal disruptions to our calendar. Although we will be transitioning to Hybrid and in-person learning in a few weeks, we will still be able to focus on academics and help your child grow as much as possible in each of the subject areas. Getting back to good routines at home, such as a regular bedtime and family dinners, helps set your child up for success during the school day. We look forward to continuing to partner with you as we head into the second half of the school year. We welcome your communication from home on ways we can best support your child's learning at school.

Learning Model Update - After winter break and prior to February 1, we are planning to have students continue in the model they participated in prior to winter break.

Students in our Hybrid Model will automatically transition to in-person learning on February 1. As a reminder, our e-Learning model, which some families selected this past fall, will continue to be offered through the end of the year.

If you plan on making a switch from your original plan to e-Learning or in-person learning on February 1, please contact us by January 7, 2021. You may email your request to Stephanie Pearson at stephanie.pearson@minnetonkaschools.org. You do not need to contact us if you plan to continue with the same learning model for your child on February 1.

Childcare - Children currently in our Childcare Program will remain enrolled until January 19, when we make the switch back to our Hybrid Model. If you are considering enrolling your child in our Childcare Program for the dates leading up to January 19, please contact Stephanie Pearson to find out if we have space available.

Grade 3 students will remain online until February 1. The Childcare Program will continue to be offered until February 1 for students in third grade.

Changes in our Models -

- **Hybrid Model runs from January 19-27:** K,1,2 in Hybrid Model at Deephaven Elementary.
- Grades 4 and 5 in Hybrid Model at MHS (Wednesday, January 20 will be an e-Learning day, just like in the fall. Wednesday January 27 will be a hybrid learning day at MHS). PLEASE NOTE THAT THE DATES FOR 4TH AND 5TH GRADE ONLY ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE. WE WILL KEEP YOU POSTED.
- Grade 3 students will remain in e-Learning until February 1. We are only allowed to bring back three grade levels at a time per site. We selected the three youngest grades to return to the Hybrid Model at Deephaven Elementary.

Other January Dates:

- January 28 and 29 No school, transition planning days for staff.
- February 1 In-person school begins for K-5 at Deephaven Elementary School.

February 1 Class Lists - Students will return from pods to their homeroom on February 1. Some grade level teachers interacted with the same pod, and your child worked with more than one teacher. As we return to homerooms, your child's teacher will be the same one that was communicated to you back in August. We will be sending out a communication this month with your child's homeroom teacher's name to ensure you have the correct information.

Incoming Kindergarten Families – Registration materials for residents is due on January 15. Families that are open enrolling must turn in their applications by January 15 as well. Please contact Stephanie Pearson at 952-401-4141 if you have any questions about kindergarten registration.

Winter Weather – Students spend 20-30 minutes outside each day at school unless the temperature or wind chill reaches -10 degrees. Be sure your child is prepared with the proper winter gear.
