FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Additional Parking Spaces Available - As many of you know, parking can be a challenge at Deephaven. With the help of our bus duty crew, we have found a way to shift all buses inside the corral to open up additional parking spots!

You are welcome to park in the spaces (identified below) previously reserved for buses.



REMINDER - Dress for the Weather – Students are outside for 30 minutes each day during recess. Temperatures need to be -10 degrees below zero actual temperature or wind chill to have indoor recess.

Behavior Expectations at Deephaven – Deephaven has high standards for student behavior and academic excellence. To maximize the time students are engaged in learning, we work to set students up for success by modeling and practicing our behavior expectations. We also use Responsive Classroom to build a strong classroom community https://www.responsiveclassroom.org/about/

When students fall short of meeting our behavior expectations, we have a thoroughly developed approach to address situations. One example includes our common language that describes behavior choices in three ways. The three phrases are Above the Line, Below the Line, and Bottom Line behaviors. We reinforce Above the Line behaviors. Below the Line behaviors are addressed by redirecting students, administering a loss of privilege, having students taking a break, or students may be referred to our Behavior Manager to process their behavior. Our Behavior Manager will give the student a consequence, if appropriate, based on the behavior. Bottom Line behaviors include any behavior that is not acceptable at any time or by anyone. An example would be punching another student. Consequences include in-school suspension, dismissal and/or out-of-school suspension for Bottom Line behaviors. The goal is to extinguish Bottom Line behaviors.

When you visit our school, you will notice that students know what is expected and enjoy being here. Our students are extremely well behaved, and learning is rarely disrupted. The expectations you have at home and the expectations we have at school help to create a positive learning environment at Deephaven. Your partnership is critical to our success with students. With 670 students, we are bound to have some misbehavior. However, it is limited, and it is addressed each time by a teacher or staff member. The overall environment is positive and engaging for students. You are always welcome to visit Deephaven and have a look for yourself.
