# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

**Love to Read/Read-a-Thon Month** continues through the end of February. Please see the PTA Pulse for more details.

**Spring Conferences** –Conferences will be held on Thursday, March 3, from 3:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. and on Friday, March 4, from 8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. Our goal is to have all our parents participate.

You will be receiving an email on Tuesday, February 15 at 5 p.m. with instructions on how to sign conferences. Please let your child's teacher know if you have questions.

Remember, that we do not have school on Friday, March 4.

**Drop off and Pick up Procedures** – Here are tips to help keep our car line moving.

- 1. Pull all the way down to the far stop sign if you are the lead car.
- 2. Have your child get out of the car anywhere along the front curb.
- 3. Have backpacks and bags ready to go.
- 4. Give hugs at home and avoid getting out of your vehicle (unless your child needs assistance).
- 5. Arrive in the morning between 7:30 7:40 to avoid the long line.
- 6. Buses arrive around 7:47 and things begin to get backed up. Dropping your child off prior to 7:45 will allow you to get through the line quicker.
- 7. Arrive at the grade level time for your child in the afternoon. Cars arriving early take up spots along the curb that are intended for other grade levels and slow down our entire process significantly.

#### Arrival times for parents:

2:30 – Grades K, 1 and siblings of K or 1 students

2:35 - Grades 2 and 3

2:40 - Grades 4 and 5

Life can be hectic, especially with young children and we understand things will not always go as planned. We simply ask that you help us out by doing your best to follow the plan. The safety of all students and parents is our top priority.
