VI. Sam McHugh and Evan Sullwold, 5th Grade Students

They presented for Destination Imagination requesting the PTO help fund them in the Global Finals.

The team name is the Flaming Gamer Cats and below is some bullet points presented:

- The team competed in the Game On (fine Arts) challenge, using Ticket to Ride as the inspiration to write a script, wire LEDs for an oversized game board, build a large wooden train car and craft a performance
- They placed 1st at Regionals and 3rd at Affiliate, qualifying them to compete at The Global Finals in Kansas City, May 22-25
- Global Finals draw over 17,000 people from around the world. The kids will be directly competing against around 100 teams in the Elementary Fine Arts Challenge
- The cost of the competition (including entry fee, travel, food, lodging, and other expenses) is around \$11,000. The team has raised about \$1,500 through corporate sponsorship. The district superintendent also pledged to help with the entry fee.

The PTO has agreed to give up to \$850 from treasury and sponsor to school activity funds. The cost will be for the pop truck, \$350 and \$500 for t-shirts and trading pins.
